On Monday 22nd March Dorothy O'Hanlon gave us an enlightening talk. We learned that, around 1066, the Normans were not only making a conquest in England, but were invading as far south as Sicily. The invasion was largely the work of one remarkable family: the twelve sons of Tancred of Hauteville who, with one exception, went to south Italy. In alliance with the Pope they absorbed the cultures of the Lombards, Greeks and Arabs and developed the brilliant kingdom of the 'Two Sicilies'. Dorothy showed us some beautiful slides of southern Italy and Sicily, some depicting the churches of Siculo-Gothic style of which the most famous is Monreale near Palermo. We look forward to hearing more about Dorothy's travels and accounts, enriched by her learning and love of Italy.

HUNTS CROSS AVENUE:

Detailed planning permission for a third new house in the former grounds of Aymestry Court was granted by the City Council in January. While we have not yet seen the detailed drawings, this should restore the building more closely to its former appearance as a shop.
